

All Wrapped Up Extended Producer Responsibility for Packaging

Oregon

➤ The Oregon Department of Environmental Quality ("Oregon DEQ") approved the first PRO plan in U.S. packaging EPR on February 21, 2025. In a press release announcing this historic milestone, Oregon DEQ stated:

The plan aims to enhance recycling, waste reduction and reuse across the state through several key initiatives, including:

- Providing funding to local governments and recycling service providers for improvements to Oregon's recycling system;
- Establishing locations around the state to collect harder-to-recycle items;
- Ensuring that collected materials are recycled responsibly;
- Creating educational resources to help people learn about recycling changes and opportunities; and
- Reducing environmental impacts of paper, packaging, and food serviceware through fee incentives and by capitalizing a new waste reduction and reuse program.

Scott Keller, the Chair of the Oregon Recycling System Advisory Council, announced that "DEQ's approval of this plan is a significant step towards better recycling in Oregon" and that "Oregon has led the way in recycling for years, and this law will help us improve even more!" As part of the rollout, CAA hosted a webinar on February 12, 2025 entitled "Oregon Program Plan: PRO Recycling Acceptance List" and a second webinar on February 26, 2025 entitled "Oregon Program Plan: Education and Outreach."

➤ The first data reporting deadline in U.S. packaging EPR is March 31, 2025, for Oregon. Pursuant to OR. ADMIN. R. 340-090-0870, producers that intend to sell or distribute covered products in or into Oregon on or after July 1, 2025 must pre-register and submit data no later than March 31, 2025. In view of this impending deadline, CAA hosted several producer reporting and producer portal training sessions throughout February to help producers



prepare. CAA released guidance last month on "Oregon Reporting Category Definitions" and a "Oregon 2025 Report Preparation Workbook." $^{\rm 1}$
